II. Semesters to Enroll in and Prescribed Duration of Study

1. Enrollment: September for the fall semester and February for the spring semester.

Two semesters constitute one academic year.

- 2. Prescribed Duration of Study: 4-6 years for bachelor's degree programs; 1-4 years for master's programs, and 2-7 years for doctoral programs.
 The prescribed duration of study for students of the School of Chinese Medicine for Post Baccalaureate is 5 years (including clerkships in clinical medicine and internships in Chinese medicine), and students may extend the study period for another two years at most.
- 3. For bachelor's degree programs, applicants who graduated from foreign high schools (e.g., a five-year high school under the British education system) but did not complete the same prescribed duration of study as local high school graduates are required to earn at least twelve additional credits within the prescribed duration of study after being admitted to ISU, in order to be eligible for graduation.
- 4. ISU will examine applications supported by a junior college diploma or academic credentials equivalent to a college diploma, and such applicants may apply for credit transfer after being admitted as freshmen or transfer students. Matters relating to credit transfer, transferring to a higher grade level, and academic studies should be subject to the Regulations for Credit Transfer by Students at I-Shou University and the Academic Rules of I-Shou University. Students should apply for credit transfer under the Regulations for Credit Transfer by Students at I-Shou University, as amended from time to time.

III. Qualifications for Application

- 1. A person of foreign nationality who has never acquired the R.O.C. nationality (*1), has never studied in Taiwan as an overseas Chinese student, and has not accepted a placement by the University Entrance Committee for Overseas Chinese Students in the current academic year may apply for admission.
- 2. A person of foreign nationality who has resided overseas (*2) for an uninterrupted period of 6 years (*3) at the time of application and satisfies the following requirements may apply for admission. A person who intends to apply for admission to the School of Chinese Medicine for Post Baccalaureate should have resided overseas for an uninterrupted period of 8 years.
 - (1) Having the R.O.C. nationality at the time of application, but having never held household registration in Taiwan since birth;
 - (2) Having had the R.O.C. nationality before, but at the time of application having lost the R.O.C. nationality for at least 8 years since the date on which a nationality revocation was approved by the Ministry of the Interior; and
 - (3) Having never studied in Taiwan as an overseas Chinese student nor accepted a placement by the University Entrance Committee for Overseas Chinese Students in the current academic year.

- 3. A person of foreign nationality who is eligible for permanent residence in Hong Kong or Macau, has never held household registration in Taiwan since birth, and, at the time of application, has resided in Hong Kong, Macau or elsewhere overseas (*2) for an uninterrupted period of 6 years may apply for admission. A person who intends to apply for admission to the School of Chinese Medicine for Post Baccalaureate should have resided overseas for an uninterrupted period of 8 years.
- 4. A person who was formerly from the Mainland Area, has foreign nationality and has never held household registration in Taiwan since birth, and, at the time of application, has resided overseas (*2) for an uninterrupted period of 6 years may apply for admission. A person who intends to apply for admission to the School of Chinese Medicine for Post Baccalaureate should have resided overseas for an uninterrupted period of 8 years.
- 5. A foreign national who was selected by a foreign government, organization or school to study in Taiwan under the Education Cooperation Framework Agreement and has never held household registration in Taiwan since birth may apply for admission with prior consent from the Ministry of Education, R.O.C.
- 6. If an international student applied for undertaking a bachelor's degree or lower level program in Taiwan, and after staying in Taiwan for less than one year, he/she for some reason discontinued his/her studies or had his/her student status forfeited, he/she may file another application for coming to Taiwan to study, but only one reapplication is permitted.
- 7. In accordance with the Ministry of Education's Letter No. Tai-Wen-Tzu 1010174503 dated September 19, 2012, **Vietnamese applicants** are required to provide a certificate of language proficiency in Chinese or English when applying for admission. For admission to a Chinese-taught program, an applicant should provide a TOCFL (Test of Chinese as a Foreign Language) certificate for Level 2 or above, or a certificate of completion of a Chinese program at Level 2 issued by the Taiwan Education Center. For admission to an English-taught program, an applicant should provide a TOEFL iBT score report (at least 26), a TOEIC score report (at least 375), or an IELTS score report (an overall band score of 3.0 or higher).
- 8. An international student who applies for college admission in Taiwan to the Taipei Economic and Trade Office in Jakarta, Indonesia, is required to provide one of the following language proficiency certificates:
 - (1) TOCFL: Level A2 or above;
 - (2) TOEFL: iBT 26 or higher; ITP 385 or higher;
 - (3) TOEIC: 375 or higher; or
 - (4) IELTS: an overall band score of 3.0 or higher.

- 9. An international student with a foreign high school graduation certificate or equivalent qualifications to those of the R.O.C. academic degree system may apply for admission to a bachelor's degree program at ISU; a bachelor's degree or equivalent qualifications for a master's program; and a master's degree or equivalent qualifications for a doctoral program.
- 10. The assessment and recognition of foreign academic credentials should be subject to the MOE Regulations Regarding International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan as well as the following rules:
 - (1) Academic credentials from the Mainland Area: The MOE Regulations Regarding the Assessment and Recognition of Academic Credentials for Mainland Area should apply.
 - (2) Academic credentials from Hong Kong or Macau: The MOE Regulations Governing the Examination and Recognition of Educational Records from Hong Kong and Macao should apply.
 - (3) The assessment and recognition of academic credentials at an adequate level of education should be conducted in accordance with the MOE Standards for Recognition of Equivalent Educational Levels for University Admission.
- 11. The foreign high school, college, or university where an applicant earned his/her graduation certificate, diploma, or academic credentials should be officially recognized by the Ministry of Education, R.O.C. Please refer to the Database for the Reference List of Foreign Universities for more details.
- 12. An international student is not permitted to re-apply to study in Taiwan if he/she has been expelled from an educational institution in Taiwan or had his/her student status forfeited due to unsatisfactory conduct or academic performance or a serious violation of any ordinances or the regulations of the educational institution.
- 13. An international student who intends to apply for transfer admission to one of the bachelor's degree programs at ISU should have already been enrolled in and studied at a college or university in Taiwan, and he/she should be subject to the criteria applicable to domestic transfer applicants. If he/she meets the criteria, he/she will be admitted to a sophomore or junior class based on the qualifications review results. (No transfer application will be considered by the School of Chinese Medicine for Post Baccalaureate.)

An applicant who is found to have violated one of the aforesaid rules should be disqualified from admission or have his/her student status forfeited, or the degree diploma issued should be revoked. ISU reserves the right to not issue any certificate to such a student.

*1: According to Article 2 of the R.O.C. Nationality Act, a person should have the nationality of the Republic of China under any of the conditions provided by the

following subparagraphs:

- (1) His/her father or mother was a national of the Republic of China when he/she was born.
- (2) He/she was born after the death of his/her father or mother, and his/her father or mother was a national of the Republic of China at the time of death.
- (3) He/she was born in the territory of the Republic of China, and his/her parents can't be ascertained or both were stateless persons.
- (4) He/she has undergone the nationalization process.
- *2: The term "overseas" refers to countries or regions other than the Mainland Area, Hong Kong, and Macau. The term "an uninterrupted period of residence" means that an individual should have stayed in Taiwan for no more than a total of 120 days in each calendar year.
- *3: The period of 6 years or 8 years mentioned above should be calculated by using the start date of the semester (February 1 or August 1) in which an applicant wishes to enroll as the end date of the period.

3. Notes:

- (1) ISU will appropriately handle applicants' personal data in accordance with the Personal Data Protection Act of the R.O.C. government, and applicants' personal data will be used only for the purpose of student recruitment (including announcements), student status management, and statistical analysis.
- (2) Applicants who had dual nationality should upload the Permit Certificate of Nationality Loss issued by the Ministry of the Interior, R.O.C., to the International Student Application System.
- (3) Late applications, unqualified applications, or incomplete submission of documents will NOT be considered by ISU.
- (4) Please retain an extra copy of all the documents uploaded for application as ISU will not return the originals to applicants.

- (5) If an applicant graduated from a senior high school in the Mainland Area, he/she should submit, upon application and enrollment, respectively, a certificate of completion of senior high education (e.g., a graduation certificate or a certificate of study with an academic transcript of all semesters) notarized in the Mainland Area and verified by the Straits Exchange Foundation.
- (6) If a bachelor's degree or master's degree was earned in the Mainland Area, the following should be uploaded upon application and submitted upon enrollment, respectively:
 - a. a photocopy of the graduation certificate/diploma;
 - b. a photocopy of the degree certificate;
 - c. a photocopy of the academic transcript of all semesters (if an applicant has studied at a bachelor's degree program for a period of less than 8 semesters, a master's program for a period of less than 2 semesters, or a doctoral program for a period of less than 4 semesters, he/she should also provide a certificate of complete enrollment issued and sealed by the school he/she graduated from);
 - d. a printed verification report or a valid online verification report (titled "Online Verification Report of Higher Education Qualification Certificate") of the graduation certificate/diploma issued by the Center for Student Services and Development (CSSD, http://www.chsi.com.cn/);
 - e. a verification report (electronically titled "Online Verification Report of Higher Education Degree Certificate") of the degree certificate issued by the CSSD, or an original printed verification report or an online verification report of the degree certificate issued by the China Academic Degrees and Graduate Education Development Center (CDGDC).
 - f. an original printed verification report or an online verification report of the academic transcript of all semesters issued by the CSSD or the CDGDC; and
 - g. the full text of the degree treatise in case of a master's degree or above.
 - * If there is difficulty in assessing or recognizing a degree earned in the Mainland Area under Article 6 of the MOE Regulations Regarding the Assessment and Recognition of Academic Credentials for Mainland Area, the following should be submitted:
 - (a) a photocopy of the notarial certificate of the graduation certificate/diploma, the degree certificate, and the academic transcript of all semesters issued by a public notary office in the Mainland Area; and
 - (b) a photocopy of the document issued by the Straits Exchange Foundation, certifying that the photocopy(ies) provided in the preceding item is (are) identical to the duplicate(s) issued by the public notary office in the Mainland Area.

VI. Acceptance

- 1. ISU's Office of Academic Affairs will conduct a preliminary examination after receiving admission applications, and applicants who have passed the preliminary examination will advance to a second review. Applicants may be notified of taking a test on professional subjects or language proficiency, if necessary. Successful applicants will be notified of enrollment after the application results have been approved by ISU's Committee of Admission for International Students.
- 2. If an applicant has applied to two or more departments and programs and passed the review, he/she should go to https://enroll.isu.edu.tw/DI/ to select the department and program he/she decides to enroll in.

VII. Notification of Application Results

- 1. A formal notification will be sent to all applicants individually.
- 2. Under no circumstances will the acceptance letter guarantee the issuance of a visa, which should be approved and issued only by the local R.O.C. diplomatic mission.

VIII. Enrollment

- 1. If any information or documents provided by an applicant or included in the application packet are found to be counterfeited, actually owned by another person, or tampered with, the applicant should be denied admission. If such an applicant has enrolled at ISU, his/her student status should be canceled and no certificate issued. If he/she has graduated from ISU, the degree awarded will be revoked and the diploma rescinded.
- 2. A complete enrollment packet will be sent to successful applicants together with a formal notification. They should follow the instructions to pay the tuition and other required fees and to complete the necessary enrollment process. Failure to complete the enrollment process will result in refusal to enroll at ISU. Upon enrollment, they should submit the passport, a photocopy of the graduation certificate (or diploma) verified by the local R.O.C. diplomatic mission as a true copy of the original, and an official academic transcript. Failure to submit any of the above will result in refusal to enroll at ISU.
- 3. When applying for a visa, successful applicants should submit a health certificate (including HIV test, positive measles & rubella antibodies, or certification of prophylactic vaccination; please only use the form provided by ISU) issued by a qualified hospital to the local R.O.C. diplomatic mission. Moreover, they should, upon enrollment, submit one copy of the health certificate to ISU's Health Section and take a group physical exam for freshmen as arranged by ISU. Please visit the website of the local R.O.C. diplomatic mission to see whether there is any specific form required for visa application.
- 4. Upon enrollment, new international students should submit proof of health and personal injury insurance, valid for at least six months starting the date of arrival in Taiwan; the said insurance should be valid in Taiwan (the proof should be verified by the local R.O.C. diplomatic mission). Those who have not purchased any insurance may pay insurance premiums and request ISU to get insurance on their behalf (only available for officially enrolled international students).
- 5. Rules regarding part-time jobs:
 - (1) Officially enrolled international students may apply for a work permit after obtaining the Alien Residence Certificate and the consent from ISU. Those who work without a valid work permit will be fined NT\$30,000 ~ 150,000.

- When international students are looking for a part-time job, safety should always be given top priority.
- (2) International students can apply to the Office of International and Cross-strait Affairs. A work permit issued by the Workforce Development Agency, Ministry of Labor, is valid for one year at most, and those with a valid work permit should not work more than 20 hours per week, except for summer and winter vacations.
- (3) In case of any further questions or concerns, please contact the Office of International and Cross-strait Affairs for more information.
- 6. Matters not mentioned herein, if any, should be subject to the MOE Regulations Regarding International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan, the MOE Regulations Governing the Assessment and Recognition of Foreign Academic Records by Institutions of Higher Education, the MOE Regulations Regarding the Assessment and Recognition of Academic Credentials for Mainland Area, the MOE Regulations Governing the Examination and Recognition of Educational Qualifications from Hong Kong and Macao, the Regulations for International Student Admissions at I-Shou University, and the resolutions adopted by ISU's Committee of Admission for International Students.

X. Scholarships

1. Taiwan Scholarship Program

International students may apply for the scholarship granted by the government of the Republic of China (R.O.C.) to the local R.O.C. diplomatic mission before arrival in Taiwan. For more information please visit: https://english.moe.gov.tw/ \rightarrow Study in Taiwan \rightarrow Scholarships \rightarrow Taiwan Scholarship Program.

- 2. ISU Scholarship for International Students:
 - Scholarship types and amounts are as follows:
 - (1) The maximum scholarship amount for new international students is the sum of the tuition and other required fees of the first academic year and a subsidy of NT\$20,000 for accommodation at one of the ISU-owned dormitories. The scholarship amount will be equally divided by two and awarded in two separate semesters after being approved by the Scholarship Committee for International Students.
 - (2) For continuing international students (excluding those granted the scholarship for new international students), the maximum scholarship amount is equal to the tuition and other required fees for one semester. The scholarship amount will be awarded after being approved by the Scholarship Committee for International Students.
 - (3) International students may do service-learning under the supervision of the Office of International and Cross-strait Affairs, and the Office will evaluate their performance on service-learning, and the evaluation results will be one of the deciding factors for the Scholarship Committee for International Students to consider applications for (continuing to receive) the scholarship.
 - (4) Scholarship recipients should report to the Office of International and Cross-strait Affairs on the first day of school. The Office will deduct the tuition, other required fees, and accommodation fees from the scholarship amount, and then return the balance to the recipients, if any. If the scholarship amount, however, is less than the total fees payable, the recipients have to pay for the difference.
 - (5) If a new international student who is also a scholarship recipient will not live on campus during the first year of study for special reasons, he/she should not request ISU to give him/her the scholarship amount used to offset accommodation fees as mentioned above.
 - (6) A successful scholarship applicant will not receive the scholarship if he/she does not complete the enrollment process for the semester when the scholarship is awarded, if he/she applies for deferral of admission, or if he/she transfers to another school. A scholarship recipient will be asked to return the full amount of the scholarship awarded in the current semester and disqualified from subsequent scholarships if he/she suspends studies or withdraws from ISU while ISU is in session, if his/her attendance rate is below 70% for the first nine weeks of the current semester due to reasons other than force majeure, or if he/she has a record of minor demerits or even severer punishment; to maintain his/her status as a student of ISU, such a student shall pay up the tuition, other required fees, and/or accommodation fees previously offset by the scholarship. A scholarship recipient

- will be ineligible to receive the approved scholarship if he/she resumes studies or has failed to receive a personal conduct score of 85 or higher in the previous semester.
- (7) The Scholarship Committee for International Students will review scholarship applications. Qualified applicants will be granted the scholarship for the first year of studying at ISU, and they have to file another application in the second year of studying here. For more information, please refer to the Regulations for International Student Scholarship at I-Shou University at: https://www.isu.edu.tw/international.
- (8) ISU reserves the right to make reasonable changes to the rules concerning the Scholarship for International Students.
