

Regulations for Inter-Divisional Course Registration by Students in Daytime and Evening Programs at I-Shou University

Adopted at the first meeting of the University Academic Council in the first semester of the academic year 1999

Amendments adopted at the third meeting of the University Academic Council in the first semester of the academic year 2000

Amendments adopted at the first meeting of the University Academic Council in the second semester of the academic year 2002

- Article 1 The Regulations for Inter-Divisional Course Registration by Students in Daytime and Evening Programs at I-Shou University (hereinafter referred to as “the Regulations”) are made by I-Shou University (hereinafter referred to as “the University”) pursuant to Item 6, Subparagraph 2, Article 10 of the Academic Rules of I-Shou University to regulate course registration between daytime and evening programs.
- Article 2 Daytime undergraduate students, evening undergraduate students, and students of two-year in-service bachelor’s degree programs are permitted to take courses offered by the other division or by other departments (programs) only after obtaining the approval of the chair of their department (the director of their program). Such students shall apply for inter-divisional course registration under the Regulations.
- Article 3 If a daytime undergraduate student has been approved by the chair of his/her department (or the director of his/her program) to take courses offered by evening programs for special reasons, he/she is permitted to take up to nine credits per semester; notwithstanding the foregoing, exceptions may be permitted with special consent from the University. Such students shall also be subject to the restriction on

the total maximum number of credits per semester.

- Article 4 For evening undergraduate students and students of two-year in-service bachelor's degree programs, the number of credits earned from daytime undergraduate programs at one semester shall not exceed one-third of the total credits acquired during the semester; notwithstanding the foregoing, exceptions may be permitted with special consent from the University. Such students shall be subject to the restriction on the total maximum number of credits per semester applicable to their daytime counterparts.
- If a freshman student of an evening bachelor's degree program has been approved by the chair of his/her department (or the director of his/her program) to take courses offered by daytime undergraduate programs for special reasons, he/she is exempted from the restriction on credits specified in the preceding paragraph, but he/she shall pay for excess course credits taken through inter-divisional course registration.
- Article 5 Departments (programs) may set a maximum enrollment limit for a course and take into consideration the teaching capacity to decide whether to grant applications for inter-divisional course registration.
- Article 6 The regulations regarding inter-divisional course registration between daytime master's programs and in-service master's programs shall be drawn up by respective departments (programs) and then reported to respective colleges and the Office of Academic Affairs for future reference.
- In case of any differences in the tuition, other required fees, or credit fees caused by inter-divisional course registration, such students shall pay the difference under the applicable regulations and rules of the University.
- Article 7 The Regulations become effective on the third day of promulgation after being adopted by the University Administration Council and ratified by the President.

Note: In case of any disputes or misunderstandings regarding the interpretation of the language or terms of the Regulations, the Chinese language version shall prevail.
