

II. Semesters of Enrollment and Prescribed Duration of Study

1. Enrollment: September for the fall semester and February for the spring semester. Two semesters constitute one academic year.
2. Prescribed Duration of Study: 4-6 years for bachelor's degree programs; 1-4 years for master's programs, and 2-7 years for doctoral programs.

The prescribed duration of study for students of the School of Chinese Medicine for Post Baccalaureate is 5 years, including clerkships in clinical medicine and internships in Chinese medicine. Students may extend their study period by up to two additional years.

3. For bachelor's degree programs, applicants who graduated from foreign high schools (e.g., a five-year high school under the British education system) but did not complete the same prescribed duration of study as local high school graduates are required,

after admission, to earn at least 12 additional credits within the prescribed duration of study to be eligible for graduation.

III. Application Qualifications

1. A person of foreign nationality who has never acquired the R.O.C. nationality (*1), has never studied in Taiwan as an overseas Chinese student, and has not accepted a placement by the University Entrance Committee for Overseas Chinese Students in the current academic year may apply for admission.
2. A person of foreign nationality who has resided overseas (*2) for an uninterrupted period of 6 years (*3) at the time of application and satisfies the following requirements may apply for admission. A person who intends to apply for admission to the School of Chinese Medicine for Post Baccalaureate should have resided overseas for an uninterrupted period of 8 years.
 - (1) Having the R.O.C. nationality at the time of application, but having never held household registration in Taiwan since birth;
 - (2) Having had the R.O.C. nationality before, but, at the time of application, having lost the R.O.C. nationality for at least 8 years since the date on which a nationality revocation was approved by the Ministry of the Interior; and
 - (3) Having never studied in Taiwan as an overseas Chinese student nor accepted a placement by the University Entrance Committee for Overseas Chinese Students in the current academic year.
3. A person of foreign nationality who is eligible for permanent residence in Hong Kong or Macau, has never held household registration in Taiwan since birth, and, at the time of application, has resided in Hong Kong, Macau, or elsewhere overseas (*2) for an uninterrupted period of 6 years may apply for admission. A person who intends to apply for admission to the School of Chinese Medicine for Post Baccalaureate should have resided overseas for an uninterrupted period of 8 years.
4. A person who was formerly from the Mainland Area, has foreign nationality and has never held household registration in Taiwan since birth, and, at the time of application, has resided overseas (*2) for an uninterrupted period of 6 years may apply for admission. A person who intends to apply for admission to the School of Chinese Medicine for Post Baccalaureate should have resided overseas for an uninterrupted period of 8 years.
5. A foreign national who has been selected by a foreign government, organization, or school to study in Taiwan under the Education Cooperation Framework Agreement and has never held household registration in Taiwan since birth may apply for admission with prior consent from the competent authorities.
6. **If an international student applied for a bachelor's degree or lower-level**

program in Taiwan, and, after staying in Taiwan for less than one year, discontinued their studies or had their student status revoked, they may submit another application to study in Taiwan; however, only one reapplication is permitted.

7. In accordance with the Ministry of Education's Letter No. Tai-Wen-Tzu 1010174503 dated September 19, 2012, **Vietnamese applicants** are required to provide a certificate of language proficiency in Chinese or English when applying for admission. For admission to a Chinese-taught program, applicants should provide a TOCFL (Test of Chinese as a Foreign Language) certificate for Level 2 or above, or a certificate of completion of a Chinese program at Level 2 issued by the Taiwan Education Center. For admission to an English-taught program, applicants should provide a TOEFL iBT score report (at least 26), a TOEIC score report (at least 375), or an IELTS score report (overall band score of 3.0 or higher).
8. International students applying for college admission in Taiwan through the Taipei Economic and Trade Office in Jakarta, Indonesia, are required to provide one of the following language proficiency certificates:
 - (1) TOCFL: Level A2 or above;
 - (2) TOEFL: iBT score of 26 or higher, or ITP score of 385 or higher;
 - (3) TOEIC: Score of 375 or higher; or
 - (4) IELTS: Overall band score of 3.0 or higher.
9. An international student holding a foreign high school diploma or credentials equivalent to those recognized under the R.O.C. academic system may apply for admission to a bachelor's degree program at ISU. Students with a bachelor's degree or equivalent qualifications may apply for a master's program, and those with a master's degree or equivalent qualifications may apply for a doctoral program.
10. The assessment and recognition of foreign academic credentials should be governed by the MOE Regulations Regarding International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan, as well as the following rules:
 - (1) Academic credentials from the Mainland Area: The MOE Regulations Regarding the Assessment and Recognition of Academic Credentials for Mainland Area should apply.
 - (2) Academic credentials from Hong Kong or Macau: The MOE Regulations Governing the Examination and Recognition of Educational Records from Hong Kong and Macao should apply.
 - (3) The assessment and recognition of academic credentials at an adequate educational level should be conducted in accordance with the MOE Standards for Recognition of Equivalent Educational Levels for University Admission.
11. **The foreign high school, college, or university from which an applicant**

obtained their diploma or academic credentials should be officially recognized by the Ministry of Education, R.O.C. Please refer to the [Database for the Reference List of Foreign Universities](#) for more details.

12. An international student is not permitted to reapply to study in Taiwan if they have been expelled from an educational institution in Taiwan or if their student status has been revoked due to unsatisfactory conduct, poor academic performance, or a serious violation of laws or institutional regulations.

An applicant found to have violated any of the above rules should be disqualified from admission, have their student status revoked, or have any degree or diploma already issued annulled. ISU also reserves the right to withhold any certificates from such students.

*1: According to Article 2 of the R.O.C. Nationality Act, a person should have the nationality of the Republic of China under any of the conditions provided by the following subparagraphs:

- (1) His/her father or mother was a national of the Republic of China when he/she was born.
- (2) He/she was born after the death of his/her father or mother, and his/her father or mother was a national of the Republic of China at the time of death.
- (3) He/she was born in the territory of the Republic of China, and his/her parents can't be ascertained or both were stateless persons.
- (4) He/she has undergone the nationalization process.

*2: The term “overseas” refers to countries or regions other than the Mainland Area, Hong Kong, and Macau. The term “an uninterrupted period of residence” means that an individual should have stayed in Taiwan for no more than a total of 120 days in any calendar year.

*3: The 6-year or 8-year period mentioned above should be calculated using the start date of the semester (February 1 or August 1) in which an applicant intends to enroll as the end date of the period.

3. Notes:

- (1) ISU will handle applicants' personal data in accordance with the Personal Data Protection Act of the R.O.C. Applicants' personal data will be used only for purposes related to student recruitment (including announcements), student status management, and statistical analysis.
- (2) Applicants who previously held dual nationality are required to upload the Permit Certificate of Nationality Loss issued by the Ministry of the Interior, R.O.C., to the International Student Application System.
- (3) **Late applications, unqualified applications, or incomplete documentation will NOT be considered by ISU.**
- (4) **Please keep an extra copy of all documents uploaded for the application, as ISU will not return any originals to applicants.**
- (5) If an applicant graduated from a senior high school in the Mainland Area, they should submit, upon application and enrollment, respectively, a certificate of completion of senior high education (e.g., a graduation certificate or a certificate of study with an academic transcript of all semesters) notarized in the Mainland Area and verified by the Straits Exchange Foundation.
- (6) If a bachelor's degree or master's degree was earned in the Mainland Area, the following should be uploaded upon application and submitted upon enrollment, respectively:
 - a. a photocopy of the graduation certificate or diploma;
 - b. a photocopy of the degree certificate;
 - c. a photocopy of the academic transcript of all semesters (if an applicant has studied at a bachelor's degree program for a period of less than 8 semesters, a master's program for a period of less than 2 semesters, or a doctoral program for a period of less than 4 semesters, they should also provide a certificate of complete enrollment issued and sealed by the school they graduated from);
 - d. a valid online verification report (titled "Online Verification Report of Higher Education Qualification Certificate") of the graduation certificate or diploma issued by the Center for Student Services and Development (CSSD, <http://www.chsi.com.cn/>);
 - e. a verification report (electronically titled "Online Verification Report of Higher Education Degree Certificate") of the degree certificate issued by the CSSD, or an original printed verification report or an online verification report of the degree

certificate issued by the China Academic Degrees and Graduate Education Development Center (CDGDC).

- f. an original printed verification report or an online verification report of the academic transcript of all semesters issued by the CSSD or the CDGDC; and
 - g. the full text of the degree treatise in case of a master’s degree or above.
- ※ If there is difficulty in assessing or recognizing a degree earned in the Mainland Area under Article 6 of the MOE Regulations Regarding the Assessment and Recognition of Academic Credentials for Mainland Area, the following should be submitted as well:
- (a) a photocopy of the notarial certificate of the graduation certificate/diploma, the degree certificate, and the academic transcript of all semesters issued by a public notary office in the Mainland Area; and
 - (b) a photocopy of the document issued by the Straits Exchange Foundation, certifying that the photocopy(ies) provided in the preceding item is (are) identical to the duplicate(s) issued by the public notary office in the Mainland Area.
- (7) Only the Bureau of Consular Affairs, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, R.O.C., and R.O.C. diplomatic missions are authorized to approve visas. For visa application requirements, please contact the R.O.C. diplomatic mission in or near your country. Please note that ISU cannot sign a “Letter of Guarantee for Visa Application to the Republic of China.”

VI. Admission Decisions

1. ISU's Office of Academic Affairs will conduct a preliminary review upon receiving admission applications. Applicants who pass the preliminary review will proceed to a second review. If necessary, applicants may be required to take a test on professional subjects or language proficiency. Admission offers will be issued to successful applicants after their application results are approved by ISU's Committee of Admission for International Students.
2. Applicants applying to two or more departments or programs and passing the review should go to <https://enroll.isu.edu.tw/DI/> to select the department or program they intend to enroll in.

VII. Notification of Application Results

1. A formal notification will be sent to each applicant individually.
2. **Under no circumstances does the acceptance letter guarantee the issuance of a visa; visas are approved and issued solely by R.O.C. diplomatic missions.**

VIII. Enrollment

1. If any information or documents provided by an applicant or included in the application packet are found to be falsified, misappropriated, or tampered with, the applicant will be denied admission. If such a violation is discovered after enrollment, the student's student status will be revoked, and no certificate will be issued. If discovered after graduation, the awarded degree will be annulled, and the diploma will be rescinded.
2. A complete enrollment packet will be sent to successful applicants along with the formal notification. They should follow the provided instructions to pay the tuition and other required fees and to complete all enrollment procedures. Failure to do so will result in denial of enrollment at ISU. Upon enrollment, they should submit their passport, a photocopy of their graduation certificate (or diploma) verified as a true copy by the local R.O.C. diplomatic mission, and an official academic transcript. Failure to submit any of these documents will also result in denial of enrollment at ISU.
3. When applying for a visa, successful applicants should submit a health certificate, issued by a qualified hospital and completed using the ISU-provided form, to the local R.O.C. diplomatic mission. The health certificate should include results of an HIV test, proof of positive measles and rubella antibodies, or documentation of prophylactic vaccination. Upon enrollment, they should also submit a copy of the health certificate to ISU's Health Section and participate in the group health check-up for freshmen arranged by ISU. They should consult the website of the local R.O.C. diplomatic mission to determine if a specific form is required for the visa

application.

4. Upon enrollment, new international students should submit proof of health and personal injury insurance valid in Taiwan for at least six months from their date of arrival; the proof should be verified by the local R.O.C. diplomatic mission. Students who have not yet obtained insurance may pay insurance premiums and request that ISU arrange insurance on their behalf (this service is available only to officially enrolled international students).
5. Rules regarding part-time employment:
 - (1) Officially enrolled international students may apply for a work permit after obtaining an Alien Residence Certificate and securing the consent of ISU. Those who work without a valid work permit will be subject to a fine ranging from NT\$30,000 to NT\$150,000. When seeking part-time employment, whether on or off campus, international students should always prioritize their personal safety.
 - (2) International students can apply to the Office of International and Cross-strait Affairs. A work permit issued by the Workforce Development Agency, Ministry of Labor, is valid for a maximum of one year. Those with a valid work permit are not permitted to work more than 20 hours per week, except during summer and winter vacations.
 - (3) In case of any further questions or concerns, please contact the Office of International and Cross-strait Affairs for more information.
6. Matters not mentioned herein, if any, should be governed by the MOE Regulations Regarding International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan, the MOE Regulations Governing the Assessment and Recognition of Foreign Academic Records by Institutions of Higher Education, the MOE Regulations Regarding the Assessment and Recognition of Academic Credentials for Mainland Area, the MOE Regulations Governing the Examination and Recognition of Educational Qualifications from Hong Kong and Macao, the Rules of International Admissions at I-Shou University, and the resolutions adopted by ISU's Committee of Admission for International Students.

Seal Engraving	Approximately NT\$50 (for opening a new account in a bank or a post office)
Prepaid SIM card	Approximately NT\$500 per month
Accommodation during Winter or Summer Vacation	Approximately NT\$4,500 - 6,000 per month (The exact amount is subject to the latest announcement issued by ISU.)

X. Scholarships

1. Taiwan Scholarship Program

International students may apply for the Taiwan Scholarship, awarded by the government of the Republic of China (R.O.C.), through the local R.O.C. diplomatic mission before arriving in Taiwan. 2. ISU International Student Scholarships:

Scholarship types and amounts are as follows:

- (1) The maximum scholarship amount per new international student includes the tuition and other required fees of the first academic year, along with a subsidy of NT\$20,000 for on-campus accommodation. Once approved by the Scholarship Committee for International Students, the scholarship amount will be divided equally and awarded over two semesters.
- (2) For continuing international students (excluding those who received the scholarship as new international students), the maximum scholarship amount per person covers the tuition and other required fees for one semester. The exact

scholarship amount will be determined by the Scholarship Committee for International Students based on each student's academic performance.

- (3) International students are required to participate in service-learning under the supervision of the Office of International and Cross-strait Affairs. The Office will evaluate students' performance, and the results will serve as an important reference for the Scholarship Committee for International Students when reviewing scholarship applications.
- (4) Scholarship recipients should report to the Office of International and Cross-strait Affairs and complete the enrollment process on the first day of school. The Office will deduct the tuition, other required fees, and accommodation fees from the scholarship amount. If the scholarship amount is less than the total fees payable, recipients are responsible for paying the balance.
- (5) If a new international student who is a scholarship recipient, under special circumstances, will not live on campus during the first year of study, they should not request ISU to disburse the portion of the scholarship intended to cover accommodation fees as specified above.
- (6) In one of the following circumstances, ISU reserves the right to require a scholarship recipient to return the full amount of the scholarship awarded for the current semester and to disqualify them from receiving future scholarships. Such recipients should be responsible for paying the tuition, other required fees, and accommodation fees previously covered by the scholarship in order to maintain their student status at ISU.
 - a. Failing to complete the enrollment process for the semester in which the scholarship is awarded;
 - b. Applying for a deferral of admission;
 - c. Transferring to another school;
 - d. Suspending or withdrawing from studies while the University is in session;
 - e. Having an attendance rate below 70 percent during the first nine weeks of the current semester for reasons other than force majeure;
 - f. Engaging in activities unrelated to academic study in Taiwan;
 - g. Having a record of minor demerits or more severe disciplinary actions;
 - h. Resuming studies after suspension; or
 - i. Having received a personal conduct score of less than 85 in the previous semester.
- (7) Scholarship recipients are not eligible to apply for other scholarships of a similar nature offered by ISU during the same academic year. International students who have received scholarships of a similar nature from the government of the Republic of China or partner corporations are not eligible to apply for the

scholarship. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the above rule does not apply to those who have obtained special consent.

- (8) The Scholarship Committee for International Students will review all scholarship applications. Successful applicants will receive the scholarship for their first year at ISU and are required to submit a new application for the second year of study.
