

Regulations for the Establishment of University Interdisciplinary Bachelor's Degree Review Panel at I-Shou University

Adopted by the University Academic Council on June 22, 2026, and promulgated with the consent of the President dated July 9, 2026

- Article 1 The Regulations for the Establishment of University Interdisciplinary Bachelor's Degree Review Panel at I-Shou University (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulations") are made pursuant to Principles for the Establishment of College Interdisciplinary Bachelor's Degrees and University Interdisciplinary Bachelor's Degrees of I-Shou University to ensure fairness in the review of interdisciplinary learning and to regulate the planning, deliberation, and governance mechanisms of curriculum modules for specialized fields.
- Article 2 To administer tasks related to the review of university interdisciplinary bachelor's degrees, the University Interdisciplinary Bachelor's Degree Review Panel (hereinafter referred to as "the Panel") is hereby established. The Panel shall consist of five to nine members, comprising the Dean of Academic Affairs, senior faculty members from each college, and faculty members with field expertise. Panel members shall serve a one-year term and may be reappointed. The Dean of Academic Affairs shall serve as an ex officio member and as the convener.
- Article 3 The Panel shall be responsible for:
1. Reviewing degree proposals submitted by students applying for a university interdisciplinary bachelor's degree;
 2. Determining and approving the names of the interdisciplinary fields of specialization proposed by students; and
 3. Handling other matters required by applicable regulations and rules to be submitted to the Panel.
- Article 4 For the review process, the Dean of Academic Affairs shall, based on the fields of study specified in the student's degree proposal, appoint panel members with relevant expertise to conduct a document review. External experts and scholars may be invited to participate in the review if necessary. Upon completion of the preliminary review, a secondary review meeting shall be convened, and the review results shall be announced before the commencement of the semester.
- Article 5 When reviewing the degree proposals submitted by students applying for a university

interdisciplinary bachelor's degree, the Panel shall consider the following criteria:

1. The clarity of the student's learning motivation and objectives;
2. The alignment and appropriateness of the proposed course planning with the curriculum modules of the field of specialization;
3. The relevance of internships, practicum, or project-based courses to the overall course planning; and
4. The suitability of the proposed titles for the field of study and the bachelor's degree.

Article 6 A quorum of at least half of the total membership will be required to validate a panel meeting, and consent from at least half of the members attending is required for resolutions. The Panel may invite students or related personnel to attend panel meetings as participants without voting power, if necessary.

Article 7 The Regulations become effective on the third day of promulgation after being adopted by the University Academic Council. The same procedure applies to any amendments to the Regulations.

Note: In case of any disputes or misunderstandings regarding the interpretation of the language or terms of the Regulations, the Chinese language version shall prevail.
