Guidelines on Offering Independent Study Courses at Doctoral

Programs at I-Shou University

Adopted by the University Administration Council on December 11, 2019, and promulgated with the consent from the President dated December 25, 2019

- I. The Guidelines on Offering Independent Study Courses at Doctoral Programs at I-Shou University (hereinafter referred to as "the Guidelines") are made by I-Shou University (hereinafter referred to as "the University") to provide international doctoral students with diverse learning channels and to meet their actual needs.
- II. The Guidelines are applicable to elective courses in doctoral programs.
- III. One faculty member may offer one independent study course each semester, and the teaching hours of the independent study course are included in the total teaching hours for the semester.
- IV. To offer an independent study course, faculty members shall file an application with a syllabus (see Appendix 1) one semester prior to the beginning of the course and obtain prior consent from the University.
- V. Faculty members offering an independent study course shall offer eighteen hours of individual guidance per credit to students, draw up a complete course plan and requirements, supervise students every week as scheduled, safely keep students' learning records and guidance records on ISU Moodle, and submit a learning outcomes report (see Appendix 2) within two weeks after the course ends.
- VI. The maximum enrollment of each independent study course is two.
- VII. The number of teaching hours of an independent study course is one-third of the number of credits of the course. If the course is offered in English, the hourly pay is multiplied by 1.5.
- VIII. Students may earn a maximum of six credits per semester from independent study courses, and the credits earned from independent study courses are capped at nine credits toward graduation requirements.
- IX. Matters not mentioned herein, if any, shall be subject to the applicable regulations and rules of the University.
- X. The Guidelines become effective on the third day of promulgation after being adopted by the University Administration Council and ratified by the President.

Note: In case of any disputes or misunderstandings regarding the interpretation of the language or terms of the Guidelines, the Chinese language version shall prevail.
