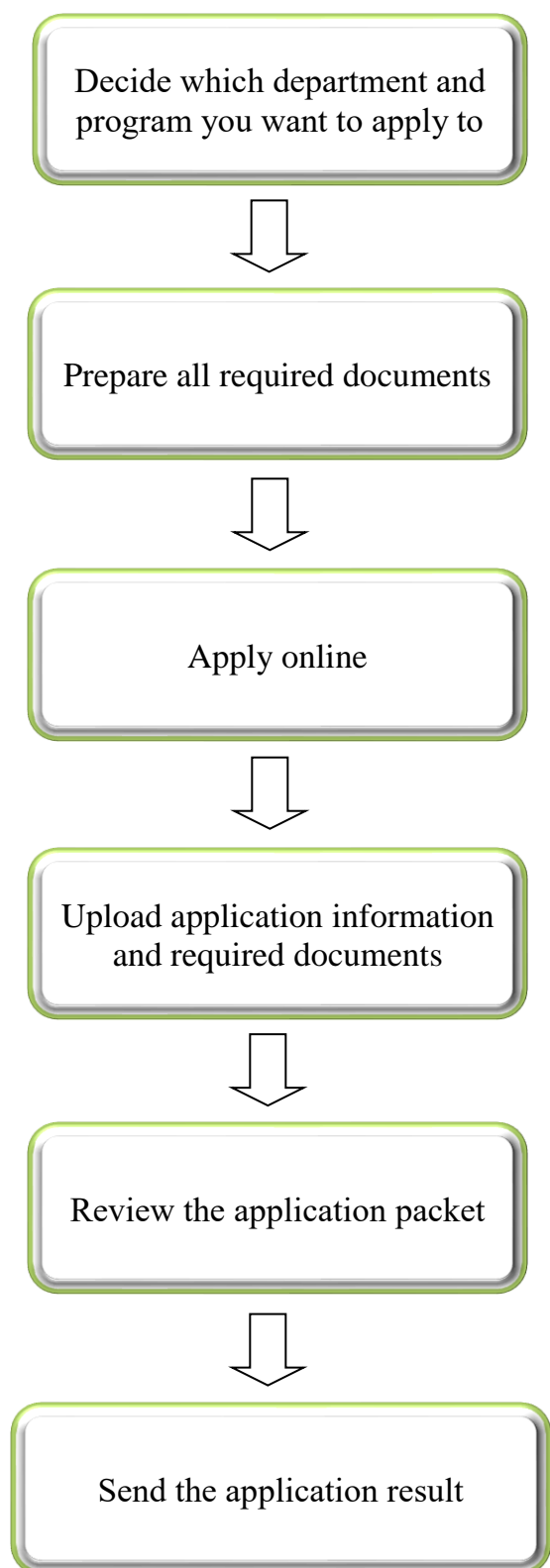

## II. Semester to Enroll in and Prescribed Duration of Study

1. Enrollment: September 2025.
2. Prescribed Duration of Study: 2 years (1 year of on-campus courses and 1 year of off-campus internships).
3. Language Proficiency Requirement: English proficiency at CEFR Level B1 or above  
【Chinese proficiency at TOCFL Level A2 or above is required in 2<sup>nd</sup> year】。

## III. Qualifications for Application

1. A person of foreign nationality who has never acquired the R.O.C. nationality (\*1), has never studied in Taiwan as an overseas Chinese student, and has not accepted a placement by the University Entrance Committee for Overseas Chinese Students in the current academic year may apply for admission.
2. A person of foreign nationality who has resided overseas (\*2) for an uninterrupted period of 6 years (\*3) at the time of application and satisfies the following requirements may apply for admission.
  - (1) Having the R.O.C. nationality at the time of application, but having never held household registration in Taiwan since birth;
  - (2) Having had the R.O.C. nationality before, but at the time of application having lost the R.O.C. nationality for at least 8 years since the date on which a nationality revocation was approved by the Ministry of the Interior; and
  - (3) Having never studied in Taiwan as an overseas Chinese student nor accepted a placement by the University Entrance Committee for Overseas Chinese Students in the current academic year.
3. A person of foreign nationality who is eligible for permanent residence in Hong Kong or Macau, has never held household registration in Taiwan since birth, and, at the time of application, has resided in Hong Kong, Macau or elsewhere overseas (\*2) for an uninterrupted period of 6 years may apply for admission.
4. A person who was formerly from the Mainland Area, has foreign nationality and has never held household registration in Taiwan since birth, and, at the time of application,

- has resided overseas (\*2) for an uninterrupted period of 6 years may apply for admission.
5. A foreign national who was selected by a foreign government, organization or school to study in Taiwan under the Education Cooperation Framework Agreement and has never held household registration in Taiwan since birth may apply for admission with prior consent from the Ministry of Education, R.O.C.
- 6. Overseas university graduates or graduands may apply for admission and obtain a bachelor's degree after two years of studies at I-Shou University.**
7. The assessment and recognition of foreign academic credentials should be subject to the MOE Regulations Regarding International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan.
- 8. The foreign high school, college, or university where an applicant earned his/her graduation certificate, diploma, or academic credentials should be officially recognized by the Ministry of Education, R.O.C. Please refer to the Database for the Reference List of Foreign Universities for more details.**

\*1: Pursuant to Article 2 of the R.O.C. Nationality Act, a person should have the nationality of the Republic of China under any of the conditions provided by the following subparagraphs:

- (1) His/her father or mother was a national of the Republic of China when he/she was born.
- (2) He/she was born after the death of his/her father or mother, and his/her father or mother was a national of the Republic of China at the time of death.
- (3) He/she was born in the territory of the Republic of China, and his/her parents can't be ascertained or both were stateless persons.
- (4) He/she has undergone the nationalization process.

\*2: The term "overseas" refers to countries or regions other than the Mainland Area, Hong Kong, and Macau. The term "an uninterrupted period of residence" means that an individual should have stayed in Taiwan for no more than a total of 120 days in each calendar year.

\*3: The period of 6 years or 8 years mentioned above should be calculated by using the start date of the semester (February 1 or August 1) in which an applicant wishes to enroll as the end date of the period.

<b>Academic Credentials (a diploma, a graduation certificate, or the proof of having an adequate level of education)</b>	<p>1. A graduand may upload the <b>certificate of enrollment for the current semester</b> and the <b>Affidavit of Delayed Submission of Bachelor's Degree Certificate</b>. His/her original diploma (or graduation certificate) should be submitted by August 3, 2025 ; failure to comply will result in the cancellation of the admission qualification.</p> <p>2. A graduate should upload the diploma (or the graduation certificate).</p>
<b>Official Academic Transcript of All Semesters</b>	The scores for each subject <b>each semester</b> , the location of the school, and the prescribed duration of study should be included in the academic transcript. If the academic transcript uploaded by an applicant cannot be assessed or recognized by ISU, the original academic transcript verified by the local R.O.C. diplomatic mission should be submitted upon enrollment (if the academic transcript is in a language other than Chinese or English, a Chinese or English translation verified by the local R.O.C. diplomatic mission or a registered translation agency is required).

A financial statement issued by a bank within the three most recent months (in a sealed envelope) as the proof of adequate financial support to cover the costs of studying at ISU (the account balance should be equal to or more than US\$4,000 or NT\$100,000).</li> <li>2. If the financial statement is not in the name of an applicant, please provide a financial affidavit and a financial statement in the name of the sponsor.</li> <li>3. Note 1: The original diploma (or academic credentials) verified by the local R.O.C. diplomatic mission should be submitted upon enrollment [if the diploma (or academic credentials) is in a language other than Chinese or English, a Chinese or English translation verified by the local R.O.C. diplomatic mission or a registered translation agency is required]; otherwise, the applicant will be considered disqualified and denied admission.

Note 2: If an applicant's original diploma (graduation certificate) is in a language other than Chinese or English, the diploma (graduation certificate) in Chinese or English issued by his/her school will also be accepted by ISU.

Note 3: During the review process, ISU may request supplementary materials, and all the applicants should cooperate with such requests.

### 3. Notes:

- (1) ISU will appropriately handle applicants' personal data in accordance with the Personal Data Protection Act of the R.O.C. government, and applicants' personal data will be used only for the purpose of student recruitment (including announcements), student status management, and statistical analysis.
- (2) Applicants who had dual nationality should upload the Permit Certificate of Nationality Loss issued by the Ministry of the Interior, R.O.C., to the International Student Application System.
- (3) **Late applications, unqualified applications, or incomplete submission of documents will NOT be considered by ISU.**
- (4) **Please retain an extra copy of all the documents uploaded for application as ISU will not return the originals to applicants.**

<b>Admission Qualifications</b>	<b>Language Proficiency:</b> English proficiency at CEFR Level B1 or above 【Chinese proficiency at TOCFL Level A2 or above is required in 2nd year】 .
	<b>Education Background:</b> Bachelor's degree in STEM-related fields such as science and engineering, electronics, electrical engineering, or information technology.
	<b>University Transcript:</b> An average grade of 70 during degree study excluding the final semester, and a recommendation letter from their department or a faculty member is required.
<b>Admission Countries</b>	Philippines, Indonesia, India
<b>Selection Methods</b>	Written review
	Interviews by the school and companies
<b>Admission Criteria</b>	1. Passed the written review and interview by both the school and the companies. 2. When necessary, applicants will be admitted based on their academic performance and language proficiency.
<b>Graduation Requirements</b>	A student of this program must fulfill a graduation requirement of 48 credits, including 18 credits of off-campus internships, 6 credits of Chinese language courses, and at least 24 credits of elective courses.
<b>Post-Graduation Employment Obligations</b>	A student of this program obligated to stay in Taiwan for two years for employment at collaborating companies upon successful completion of their studies and obtaining their degree, as assessed by both the school and the companies.

## VI. Notification of Application Results

1. A formal notification will be sent to all applicants individually.
2. Under no circumstances will the acceptance letter guarantee the issuance of a visa, which should be approved and issued only by the local R.O.C. diplomatic mission.

## VII. Enrollment

1. If any information provided by an applicant or included in the application packet is

- found to have been counterfeited, actually owned by another person, or tampered with, the applicant should be denied admission. If such an applicant has enrolled at ISU, his/her student status should be canceled and no certificate issued. If he/she has graduated from ISU, the degree awarded will be revoked and the diploma rescinded.
2. A complete enrollment packet will be sent to successful applicants together with a formal notification. They should follow the instructions to pay the tuition and other required fees and to complete the necessary enrollment process. Failure to complete the enrollment process will result in refusal to enroll at ISU. Upon enrollment, they should submit the passport, a photocopy of the graduation certificate (or diploma) verified by the local R.O.C. diplomatic mission as a true copy of the original, and an official academic transcript. Failure to submit any of the above will result in refusal to enroll at ISU.
  3. When applying for a visa, successful applicants should submit a health certificate (including HIV test, positive measles & rubella antibodies, or certification of prophylactic vaccination; please only use the form provided by ISU) issued by a qualified hospital to the local R.O.C. diplomatic mission. Moreover, they should, upon enrollment, submit one copy of the health certificate to ISU's Health Section and take a group physical exam for freshmen as arranged by ISU. Please visit the website of the local R.O.C. diplomatic mission to see whether there is any specific form required for visa application.
  4. Upon enrollment, newly admitted international students should submit proof of health and personal injury insurance, valid for at least six months starting the date of arrival in Taiwan; the said insurance should be valid in Taiwan (the proof should be verified by the local R.O.C. diplomatic mission). Those who have not purchased any insurance may pay insurance premiums to and request ISU to get an insurance on their behalf (only available for officially enrolled international students).
  6. Matters not mentioned herein, if any, should be subject to the MOE Regulations Regarding International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan, the MOE Regulations Governing the Assessment and Recognition of Foreign Academic Records by Institutions of Higher Education, the MOE Regulations Regarding the Assessment and Recognition of Academic Credentials for Mainland Area, the MOE Regulations Governing the Examination and Recognition of Educational Qualifications from Hong Kong and Macao, the Regulations for International Student Admissions at I-Shou University, and the resolutions adopted by ISU's Committee

of Admission for International Students Admissions Committee.

<b>Health Insurance (after having stayed in Taiwan for 6 months, international students may apply for joining the NHI program)</b>	NT\$3,000 (1) International students who have stayed in Taiwan for a total of 180 days (calculated from the day of receiving the Alien Resident Certificate) and have left Taiwan only once for less than 30 days are eligible to join the National Health Insurance (NHI) program. When booking airline tickets for going home during the summer vacation, international students must pay attention to the total number of days of the trip (not to exceed 29 days) to retain the right to join the NHI program. (2) Starting the second semester after enrollment, international students who are ineligible for the NHI program should maintain the group health insurance according to law. (3) The NHI premiums will be collected starting the second semester after enrollment for a period of 6 months at a time. The monthly premium is approx. NT\$826 and the total amount for one semester is NT\$4,956 (subject to change made by the National Health Insurance Administration, Ministry of Health and Welfare).

#### 5. Incidentals after Studying at ISU

## 2. Terms and Conditions for Industry-Academia Collaboration Scholarship

Student who withdraws from the specialized program or fails to fulfill employment contract after graduation, the repayment principles for the scholarships as follows:

1. If the circumstances are not under student control, there is no requirement for repayment:
  - (1) Due to the operational adjustment, the original collaborating industry ceases to provide living allowance to student during their learning and student is unable to achieve additional support from other industry, leading the student's withdrawal from the specialize program.
  - (2) Due to the operational adjustment, the original collaborating company has no job vacancies available for employment upon the student's graduation and , and despite the school's efforts in providing career guidance and facilitating job placement, the student is unable to secure suitable employment opportunities.
  - (3) If the collaborating company, during the student's employment period, encounters situations as specified in Article 14, Paragraph 1 of the Labor Standards Act, leading the student to terminate the contract, and despite the school's efforts in providing career guidance and facilitating job placement, the student is still unable to find a suitable company for subsequent employment.
  - (4) Student's death, severe illness, or an unforeseen accident preventing them from continuing their studies or employment, a certified document issued by a teaching hospital rated at or above the level of accreditation by the Ministry of Health and Welfare, stating the student's inability to continue education or employment, or in cases where significant family upheaval due to an accident prevents the student from pursuing education or employment, as verified by the

school.

2. If the circumstances are under student control, requirement for repayment:
  - (1) Withdrawal from the specialized program during the academic period due to personal reasons such as applying for transfer, changing majors, absence, or returning to one's home country. Even after guidance provided by the school, if the student chooses to leave the specialized program or if the school, in accordance with its regulations, initiates withdrawal or expulsion.
  - (2) Poor academic performance, failure to meet the evaluation standards set by both the school and the collaborating industry. Even after school guidance, student fails improve, and in accordance with the school regulations, the student faces withdrawal or expulsion. In such cases, the student is required to repay the previously received industry-academia scholarships.
  - (3) After graduation, student chooses not to pursue employment with the collaborating industry or in the relevant industrial field, or if, after employment, the student violates company regulations leading to lawful termination of the labor contract, and after school guidance, no improvement is observed, the student is obligated to repay the received industry-academia funding.
  - (4) If a student, during the employment period with the collaborating industry, does not complete the specified duration for receiving industry-academia scholarship, repayment should be made based on the proportion of the remaining months unemployed; for periods less than one month, one month's repayment is required.
